Homemade Frozen Yogurt

There is really nothing cuter than watching a dog lick from a cup between his paws. It's one of life's great pleasures. Instead of sending you off for pre-made treats, whip up a batch of Frosty Paws at home. It's so easy, even your dog could do it!



Here's all you need:

- 1 quart vanilla yogurt (preferably nonfat)
- 1 ripe banana
- 2 tablespoons peanut butter
- 2 tablespoons honey.

First, puree the banana in a blender. Add the peanut butter and honey and continue processing until smooth. Then, add yogurt and process until all ingredients are blended together.

Pour the mix into small containers like Glad reusable mini containers or Dixie 3-ounce mini cups. Freeze until solid and you'll make about 10 per batch.



AKC Legislative Report: Gail LaBerge and Michele Henson (Stone Mountain State Congresswoman) met for lunch for discussion. There are several mandatory spay neuter (MSN) language suggestions being sent to members of the Georgia Assembly to be considered for a bill. Expect this in the upcoming January session. The GCC and Sue Hardwick will keep the club informed if a letter writing campaign will be needed.

Report of Treasurer

Vickie Herring presented the Treasurer's report. Our Total Balance as of Sep 1, 2009, is \$21,829.75 with monies held in Reserve for the Health and Education Fund of \$2,444.14 and the Trophy Fund of \$393.13, resulting in a General Fund balance of \$18,992.48.

Trophy Committee – Vickie Herring shared an example trophy with the meeting. These will be hand painted by a local artist. She had Trophy Fund forms available for donations.

Committee Reports

Show Committee – The Specialty is scheduled for Thursday Feb 4, 2010. The AKC has approved our event and our judging contract with Shelagh Waters is in place. Bob Whitney signed the 2011 judging contract.

In order to finalize the banquet, the Board presented the following options to set the price:

\$40 a plate without wine, or \$45 a plate with a bottle each of red and white wine at the table. Membership voted for \$45 the Banquet dinner with Wine.

Judging Committee – 2011 Regular Judging is in place. The committee is identifying possible Sweeps judges.

Auction Committee – We have begun to receive items, and we are sending out letter to vendors in October.

Social Committee – Our Fall Puppy Picnic is scheduled for Sunday November 15. Sharon will be organizing the eVite for membership, and the menu is hot dog & hamburgers and covered dishes.

Bylaws Committee – The Bylaws updates are progress. The November meeting is the target to review the changes, in conjunction with the Puppy Picnic.

Program Committee – The October program will be Tim Link, a local animal communicator. Our 2010 programs will start with the topics of Probiotics and then Cardiology as scheduling permits.

Newsletter – The newsletter will be mailed out Monday Sep 7 and Sharon will be out of town for the rest of the month.


All About Cavaliers
